- The referees are as young as 14 years old. They are sometimes children themselves. More importantly, they are human and can make mistakes. If the referee makes a bad call, acknowledge that they may have not had the same view point as you. If you feel that the referee is truly "terrible", please write info@hulmevillesoccer.org and let us know. We will work with them to improve their game.
- Finally, always be encouraging to everyone on the field. They are putting themselves out there, they are being measured amongst their peers. The last thing they need is for someone else to degrade them, especially an adult. If you cannot keep negative comments to yourself, please walk away.
